- 1 Pharisees, Ananias, __, the rich young ruler, etc are few people, who approached God with idols (something stand between us and God) in their hearts.
- 5 Any Israelite who set up idols in his heart and went to a prophet to inquire of the Lord, then He would set his face against that man and made him a __.
- 7 Another prophet, who mentioned Israel as an unfaithful wife.
- 8 Ezekiel's first parable: Israel the fruitless tree. It is a symbol for the nation of Israel in the Bible. This tree is only good to bear fruits, can't use for building houses or furniture. since it is not performing its only prescribed duty, it would be burned. So would God deal with His people!
- 10 The sovereign Lord says: " I will deal with you as you deserve because you have despised my oath by breaking the covenant. Yet I will remember the covenant I made with you in the days of your youth, and I will establish a new covenant with you." (new covenant) Eze.11:17-21
- 12 God would set free His people from the false prophetesses, who disheartened the __ with their lies when the Lord had brought them no grief.
- 15 __ was a contemporary prophet to Ezekiel.
- 16 "Your father was an Amorite, your mother a Hittite, your older sister was Samaria and your younger sister was __". When Abraham (Father of the nation of Israel) came to Canaan, they were already living there. Because of their long association with the Canaanites and their idolatry, God ascribed their birth to the Canaanites.
- 17 For the sake of a few righteous men, __ wouldn't have destroyed. Gen.18:26-32. But even if the presence of three righteous men like Noah, Job, and Daniel couldn't save Jerusalem, only they could save themselves.

- 1 Israelites built shrines at the head of every street, sacrificed their children as food to the idols, and their idolatry spread to Egypt, Philistine, Assyria, and Babylonia. Therefore God would allow them to oppress the Israelites and then His wrath against His people would __.
- 2 The __ of Israel said peace when there was no peace out of their imagination.
- 3 A false prophetess who opposed Nehemiah's intention to finish rebuilding the wall. Neh.6:14
- 4 __ was the father of Canaan, and Canaan was the father of Sidon, Hittites, Jebusites, Amorites ... and the borders of Canaan reached from Sidon toward Sodom. (Gen.10:15-19).
- 6 The sovereign Lord declared: He would make Jerusalem desolate because Israelites had been __.
- 9 Eze.16:4-6 describes Israelites' slavery in the land of __. Israel was compared to an abandoned child.
- 11 Israelites copied the detestable practices of their neighbors and soon became more __ than them.
- 13 Ezekiel's second parable: Israel the unfaithful wife. God graciously saved Israelites from their slavery, entered into a covenantal relationship (Ex.19:14), and adorned her with costly jewels. Her fame spread on account of her beauty, then she in her beauty and became unfaithful (during the time of David and Solomon).
- 14 The word of the Lord: "If a country sins against me by being unfaithful, I will send the sword, __, wild beasts, and plague upon it."
